You need also to discuss what role it played in, say, the phenomenon of imperialism or events leading up to World War I. Link it to other significant persons, places, and/or things. You may want to do some research on the Internet to gather information. Be selective, however, in what you choose to write down because you will have on average only 5 minutes per ID.
